Five years working in Prep/Recovery. I have greeted patients. I have completed a full respiratory and cardiac assessment. I have interpreted all EKG readings prior to entry into the endoscopy suite. On recovery, I have monitored vital signs; including EKG rhythms. I have determined, based on protocol for moderate sedation (or if Propofol administration is required) on patient ability to be discharged. Safety is always paramount with patient discharge and protocol is well place. In the role of moderate sedation RN (when used by a MD whom prefers Versed and Fentanyl),

I was responsible for the general progression of the endoscopy day. I would collaborate with the pre/recovery staff RNs in order to facilitate a proper and safe environment for the patients and the endoscopy staff. Scheduling of patient times would be part of my ideas: as well as: proper medication for the patients and prescribed by the MD. By using a multi-faceted approach to care for my staff and patients: I believe that my abilities with be a welcome asset to any group whom is looking for a experienced, well rounded BSN.

In the PACU role; I assisted in the care of the emediatilly completed surgical patient. My realm included: hernioplatsy, Ceasarian biths, total joint (knee, hip) replacements, post-pacemaker placement, total abominal and vaginal hysterectomies, bowel recesections, tonsill and adenoid removal, pedicatric cases that required surgery, and the like. My average was two recoveries at a time with other PACU RN's availble if required.
