



Grade 1: Sunday School Final Review Sheet



- 1 DAY 1: On the first day of creation, God said, "Let there be light." And there was light. He called the light the name we use now - - day. And the darkness He called night
- 2 DAY 4: On the fourth day, God made the sun, moon, and stars. He said, "Let there be light ... to divide the day from the night; let them be for signs and seasons, and for days and years." The greater light He made to rule the day – our sun. The lesser one He made to rule the night - - our moon.
- 3 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.
- 4 God blessed Adam and Eve and said, "All that you see is for you to use and eat, but never touch or eat from the "Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil" for the day you eat its fruit, you will die."
- 5 Eve looked at the fruit and thought how good and tasty it looked. And so she believed the serpent's lie and ate some of the fruit!
- 6 Cain was the elder son of Adam and Abel was the younger son. Abel gave the best as an offering to the Lord. God accepted Abel's offerings, but did not accept Cain's offerings. Cain was very angry he killed Abel in the field.
- 7 Enoch walked with God for 300 years. Enoch was 365 when he was taken up
- 8 God asked Noah to make an ark to escape the flood that God was going to send on the earth because of the wickedness of the people. Noah made the ark and a pair of each creature was taken onto the ark. It rained upon the earth for Forty days and Forty Nights. Noah's family of 8 was spared.
- 9 The waters prevailed upon the earth for 150 days. Noah sent out a dove to see if the land was dry and the dove brought an olive leaf from the earth. God preserved Noah and his family from the flood.
- 10 Zacharias and Elisabeth are the parents of John the Baptist.
- 11 There lived at this time in Jerusalem a very old man. His name was Simeon. He was a very good and wise man. Once, while Simeon was praying, God told him that he would not die until he had seen the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. One morning in the very early spring Simeon knew that God wanted him to go to the temple at once. He went to the temple and prayed and waited. All at once Simeon saw Joseph and Mary, with the Babe Jesus Christ in her arms, coming up the steps of the temple.
- 12 Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea
- 13 The wise men opened their treasures and presented Jesus with gifts of gold and of frankincense and of myrrh.
- 14 An angel also came to Joseph in a dream. God told him to get up and leave Bethlehem. So, Joseph got up in the middle of the night and took Mary and Jesus to another place. They traveled to the country of Egypt which is in Africa. Joseph obeyed God and followed immediately. It is a good thing that Joseph listened to God because King Herod decided to kill all the baby boys under the age of 2 in Bethlehem to make sure that Jesus did not live.
- 15 When Jesus was 12, He and Mary and Joseph went to Jerusalem (from Nazareth) for the celebration of Passover.
- 16 After 3 days they found Jesus sitting in the temple among doctors, listening to them and asking them questions. All who heard Jesus speak were astonished at his understanding and ability to answer questions. When Mary found Jesus, she asked "Son, why has Thou thus dealt with us? Behold, Thy father and I sought thee sorrowing." Jesus said, Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be about my father's business?"
- 17 John was a man who wanted to live a very simple life. For food he ate insects like locusts (which are kind of like grasshoppers) and he would find some wild honey to eat with them. John continued to preach and baptize people until one day Jesus came by to be baptized. And just as soon as Jesus was baptized the sky opened up and the Holy Spirit came like a beautiful white dove and landed right on Jesus shoulder. "
- 18 Then was Jesus was tempted of the devil when he had fasted forty days and forty nights, he was hungry.
 - (1) The devil said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread. But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.
 - (2) Then the devil taketh him up into the holy city, and set him on a pinnacle (peak) of the

temple, And said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down: for it is written, He shall give his angels charge concerning thee: and in their hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone. Jesus said unto him, It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God.

(3) Again, the devil took him up into an exceeding high mountain, and showing Jesus all the kingdoms of the world, and the glory of them; And the devil said unto him, All these things will I give thee, if thou wilt fall down and worship me. Wine came from the Jars. Jesus had performed his first miracle.

20 The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. Jesus poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. Jesus told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade."
