Primary responsibilities include triaging incoming referral calls and delegating responses, complete and total care of organ donors in both brain dead and DCD within an ICU setting. Application of care includes, but is not limited to: meeting with donor family to review and record complete donor medical history, making on-site clinical determinations for donor stability for transport, medicine administration, transportation of donor to the MidAmerica Transplant medical facility, maintaining clinical stability and bedside management during donation process, obtaining cultures and labs, maintaining communication with transplant centers throughout the entire donation process, following UNOS guidelines in allocating all transplantable organs with appropriate recipients, setting operation schedules to accommodate multiple transplant centers and procuring surgeons, finalizing any travel preparations for staff and organ deployment as needed, operating room care, and proper processing and packaging of organs for delivery to hospitals according to UNOS standards.
