- **Title:** Nursing Utilizing Activity Apron To Prevent Falls and Restraint Application
- **Date:** July 2021
- Explanation: Multiple falls related to patients with periods of confusion had occurred on Multi-Trauma Intermediate Care- 6 in combination with providers expressing concern in rounds at the increased use of restraints and antipsychotic medication administration prompting the need for an alternative intervention. A new standard for restraint application was created through a nursing driven protocol. CAM ICU scores in combination with neurological assessments will determine if activity apron is appropriate to apply ideally before behavior escalates to prevent restraint application.
- **Interventions:** Application of an activity apron, data collection, trending data, pre and posttest surveys to assess baseline understanding and retention of knowledge
- Current process: Implementation and data collection process
- Role: Co-Lead
- Unit based Process Improvement: Unit based

- **Title:** How A Health Literacy Based Education Tool Utilizing The Teach Back Method Improves Incentive Spirometer Compliance Compared To Those Without Access
- Question: Does a health literacy based education tool using the teach back method improve incentive spirometer compliance in surgical patients compared to those with no access?
- **Date:** New Nurse Graduate Residency Program Evidence Based Practice Submission April 2020
- Recommendations: Health literacy Pamphlet, Teach back method, Partner with Us
- **Impact:** Success of the intervention was measured through the use of a pre and post survey data collected from surgical patients as well as nuse and provider teaching effectiveness.
 - Evaluations of this project will be completed every six months to evaluate teaching effectiveness of teaching tools and patients outcomes will be assessed to verify Incentive Spirometer compliance.
