I am currently on contract as a traveler nurse with AMN at this time. I work on the Palliative/Med-Surgical unit at Covenant Hospital in Lubbock, Texas. My job requirement as a caretaker is to assist hospitalized patients with their medication regimen, as well as treatments to assist with pain control, and transitioning from the hospital environment to a home environment. The unit also consist of overflow from other medical-surgical units in the facility. I am responsible for daily head to toe assessments as well as keeping physicians up to date with changes in my patient's condition.

As a staff nurse I am responsible for assessing patients and ensuring that they are properly medicated, as well as receiving proper treatment. As an oncology nurse, administering chemotherapy drugs via intravenous, oral, i. V push. I am also responsible for rotating to the oncology clinic on an as needed basis to assist with the outpatient setting. I work with orthopedic patients post operative care for surgical procedures such as Hip,knee replacement, Cholecystectomy as well.

Care Manager

Humana - Killeen, TX August 2018 to April 2020 As a care manager I was responsible for the assessment and evaluation of members needs, and required to assist members and their families with appropriate resources for their care. I was responsible for following up with discharge planners on all hospitalizations of clients that were assigned to my roster. I worked with members who were long term, as well as members who came to the program during the transition period which was 30 days. If the member qualified to be moved from transition to long term based off qualification of the program, and assessment that the care manager was responsible for doing, than member would be moved to long term program. I did in-home visits twice a month with members prior to Coved reassignment. During Coved reassignment, I did telework from home with following up with monthly calls which consist of two phone calls a month for each member. I also conducted Covid questionnaires screens while doing telephonic calls. I assisted members with locating local food banks, as well as ensuring members had medication in home, as well as making their schedule follow up appointments with their primary doctors. I educated members and their family members on any post operative education that follows. As a care manager, I also was the liaison for the member and his or her primary attending.

Director of Nursing

I was responsible for overseeing the daily functions of an 82 bed long term care nursing facility department, and the managerial day to day operations including the nursing budget for the facility. As the Director of Nursing, I was responsible for staffing operations, providing and implementing programs such as infection control, fall risk management, quality of care, as well as performance improvement program, and proficiency rater for all 32 nursing personnel. As a Director of Nurses, daily functions included managing FTE's for the facility ensuring that adequate staffing was scheduled for meeting the required number of hours to meet patient care needs. Daily rounds made with Assistant nurse managers on Halls 1 & 2, educational leader on new policies, and monthly in-services with the staff. I lead quarterly meetings with the medical director, regional pharmaceutical representative, facility MDS coordinator, physical therapist director, dietary manager, social worker and both assistant nurse manager of the facility. The idt team discussed and reviewed ways to continue to improve patient outcomes. I was responsible for investigating and reporting any issues that were outline within the scope of The Department of Disability and Aging. My performance was reviewed on a quarterly basis by my regional vice president and Senior Nursing advisor. A facility scorecard was used to evaluate my nursing performance, as well as my managerial skills in maintaining within the budget when it came to Fte's, nursing supplies, and Occupational injuries. I was the facility liaison who coordinated and worked with human resources on occupational injuries, and that guidelines were being met through Osha. I was reviewed and surveyed on a yearly basis from The Department of Aging to see if the facility met Nursing home guidelines. As the Director of Nursing of the facility, during state inspection, I was responsible for assisting state officials with documents, and nursing rounds. I was to assist in any investigations that were reported to the state, as well as to the inspector general. As the Senior Rn in the facility, I was responsible for reviewing possible admissions into the facility based off physical assessments, and reviewing medical records that were faxed with permission from family and residents from area hospitals. I networked with several other facility nursing directors in the area. I reviewed charting documentation on a daily basis that was required for Medicare patients. I reviewed Minimum Data Set(MDS), resident documentation, and completed physical assessments to ensure that residents were being coded properly in the facility. I assisted another sister facility of the company with evacuation of her residents that were sent to my facility during the evacuation period when Hurricane Rita made landfall September 23rd 2005. Arrangements were made with regional and local pharmacist for additional needs for medical supplies, as well as coordination with the facility dietary manager ensuring that the dietary budget was adjusted as well to ensure the facility

could meet the needs of any additional residents. During the evacuation period of Hurricane Rita in 2005, the facility received and supported local hospitals that were in need of temporary housing with residents who were looking to be placed in areas that were directly effected by Hurricane Rita. As the Director of Nursing, I was second in command of the facility when the administrator was out of the building. I was responsible for overseeing the administration department, as well as the maintenance. I was required to participate in monthly conference calls with the administrator to discuss financials of the facility with the regional and vice-regional president. I was responsible for doing Time and Leave with staff, and assisting human resource with any pay roll issues. I collaborated with multiple discipline throughout the facility such as hospice and home health agency, as well as Va community nurses who visited the facility to follow up on care with veteran residents who are placed there. I received outstanding reviews for my leadership and guidance from state reports, as well as facility reports. As the Director of Nurses I was the quality manager and utilization review nurse for the facility. I was responsible for reviewing charts and ensuring that patients were receiving proper treatments for diagnosis, as well as specific reimbursement for the insurance plan. I often spoke with physicians and nurse practitioner from outside facilities in regards to plan of care and treatments being performed. As MDS coordinator supervisor I was responsible for ensuring that meetings were being met between managed care coordinators and mds coordinators to validate reimbursement for specific treatments.
